Udemy is an online learning and teaching marketplace with thousands of courses on a myriad of topics. Want to learn ethical hacking? There's courses for that. Have an interest in becoming a wedding photographer? Udemy has you covered. Maybe you want to become a certified animal reiki practitioner? Yes, that's a thing and you can complete your certification with Udemy.

The courses can be accessed online or on the app, and with lifetime access to your courses you can learn on your own schedule.

And in case you need any more reasons to check out Udemy, they currently have a new year's sale going on with many of their courses marked down to just \$9.99.
